Use Case

Nine years ago, Carl was developing Excel reports using Excel VBA. He wanted a third party tool that could reside on a server to replace Excel because it was so memory intensive. XIsIO is very lean on memory consumption—this is part of what makes it so fast but also enables you to use it to create server middleware.

Essential XIsIO was one of the first Excel manipulation libraries available for the .NET platform. When Syncfusion released it in 2003, Carl began using it almost immediately.

Essential XIsIO is a .NET library (written in C#) that can read, write, and modify Microsoft Excel files. It features a full-fledged object model similar to the Microsoft Office Automation libraries and can be used on systems that do not have Microsoft Excel installed, making it an excellent report engine. Essential XIsIO enables users to create richly formatted Microsoft Excel reports in Windows Forms, ASP.NET, WPF, ASP.NET MVC, and Silverlight applications.

"End users, especially those in finance, like seeing reports in Excel and using live formulas. Syncfusion reporting tools provide the versatility of a spreadsheet—reports can be e-mailed and data can be cut and pasted. Also, since reports conveniently go directly into Excel, users can insert comments and use the other features they are familiar with," stated Ganz.
